Nurses, medical assistants, mental health professionals still needed

Dr. Eric Bannec, the VIM clinic's medical director, said the clinic needs more registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, medical assistants and mental health professionals.

"We are hiring an extra nurse specialist to help us with the nursing shortage, which is cutting into our budget," he said. "More nurse volunteers will really help us in the long run."

Bannec said 18 mental health workers — psychologists, psychiatrists and social workers — have volunteered their services.

"Those are pretty good numbers, but not enough to provide daily, on-site evaluation of patients," he said.

"So we'll start off offering mental health services once or twice a week, and referring difficult patients to psychiatrists in the community."
